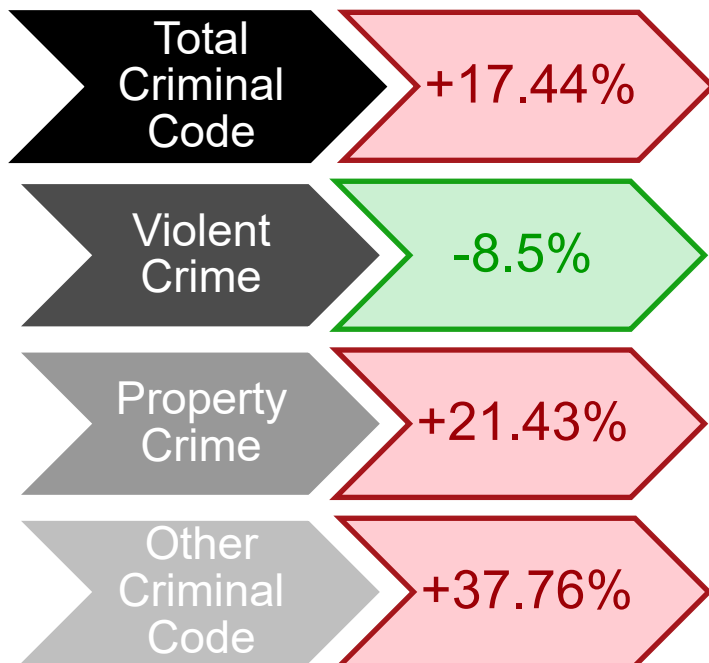

UCR Crime Type > Q1 % Change



Violent Crime Trend

Violent Crime decreased due to a lower number of Criminal Harassment (-32%) files.

Property Crime Trend

Property crime increased, with increases in Break and Enter Business (+182%), Mischief to Property (+43%), and Shoplifting (+79%).

Other CC Crime Trend

Other Criminal Codes offences increased, with the main drivers being Breach of Conditions (+233%), and Sex Offences (+700%). The file changes of these occurrence types for the quarter were +35 files for Breach of Conditions and +7 files for Sex Offences.

Mental Health and Apprehensions increased in Q1 compared to the previous year.

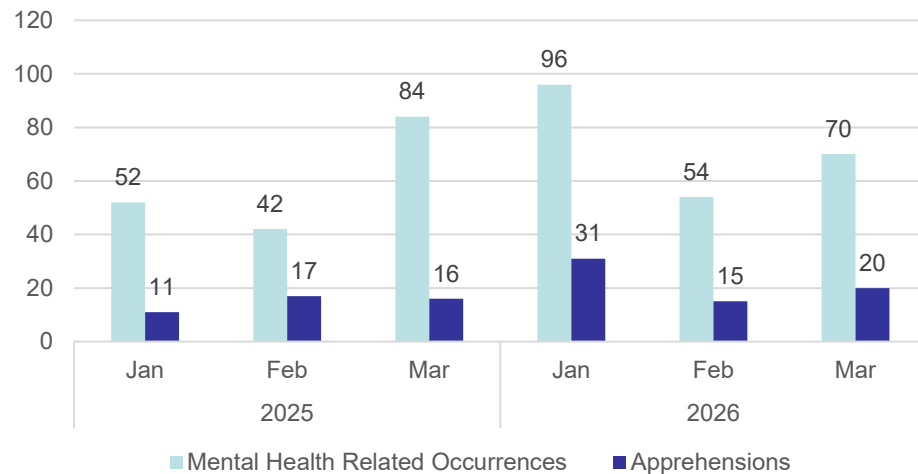
Mental Health Related Occurrences

- In 2026-Q1, mental health related occurrences increased 24% compared to the previous year.
- The greatest increase was observed in January (+85%).
- The total increase of occurrences for the quarter was +42 files.

Apprehensions

- Of the mental health-related occurrences in 2026-Q1, 30% resulted in apprehensions.
- Mental-health related apprehensions this quarter increased 50% compared to the previous year.
- The largest increase was in January (+182%), with 31 apprehensions overall.
- The total increase of apprehensions for the quarter was +22 files.
